

# SCHOOL IN NEWS

**W**here would our world be today if we deemed all major medical experiments as unethical?

Nearly every medical breakthrough involves animal testing and research. If you've ever taken antibiotics, had a vaccine, gone through a blood transfusion, dialysis, an organ transplant, chemotherapy, bypass surgery or joint replacement, you have benefited from animal testing.

Science is one of the mediums through which we can progress. If we restrict research and development to our conventional understanding of ethics, our world would be a lot less developed. The experiment by the Chinese researchers of implanting human brain genes in monkeys should not be considered unethical.

In fact Su Bing, one of the lead researchers in the experiment from the Chinese Academy of Sciences' Kunming Institute of Zoology, said that the experiment was reviewed by the university's ethics board and followed not only Chinese and international best scientific practices, but also international animal rights standards.

We know that the size of human brain and cognitive abilities dramatically changed evolution. Understanding the mechanisms governing these changes can be extremely important in objectifying the genetic mechanism of human brain evolution. Su Bing said, "In the long run, such basic researches will also provide valuable information for the analysis of the etiology and treatment of human brain diseases (such as autism) caused by abnormal brain development."

Millions suffer from diseases like autism around the world. Experiments like this can make strides in the treatment of such diseases. It should be common understanding that even if such experiments overlap with some of our conventional eth-

ical values, being able to treat people with such diseases, is a more moral stance to take. Hence, this experiment of implanting human brain genes in monkeys is not only rational, but also righteous.

Scientists create monkeys with human brain genes

**S**o, are monkeys the new guinea pigs? In an ethically fraught experiment in China, scientists introduced copies of the human brain gene microcephalin into the embryos of macaque monkeys to see if they would make them any smarter.

Of the 11 transgenic monkeys the experiment was conducted upon, 6 died. The remaining five were subjected to a series of MRI brain scans to gauge their intellectual acumen.

This research has come at a time when the world is trying to prove the myth of human exceptionalism. "The procedure is often lethal. Regarding the five survivors, what kind of lives will they have

going forward, altered as they are and confined to an experimental laboratory?" asks anthropologist Barbara J King. There's a growing understanding that experiments on animals don't work well to study complex human processes and are ethically

unacceptable due to elevated risk of harm to the animals.


Martin Styner of University of North Carolina noted that some aspects of this study won't be allowed in a country with stricter regulations such as the US. In fact, the research is being regarded as an ethical nightmare and was unable to find a publisher in the West.

In her 2010 paper titled "The ethics of using transgenic non-human primates to study what makes us human," bioethicist Jacqueline Glover wrote, "To humanize apes is to cause harm. Do not create a being that can't have a meaningful life in any context."

In Charles Darwin's ideas about evolutionary continuity, there are no "lower" or "higher" animals. Humans are indeed unique, big brained, arrogant, over-populating and over-consuming mammals, but individuals of other species are also special in their own ways.

For two centuries, various animals have borne the brunt of our quest to combat human diseases. But animal testing in the name of mere scientific progress is morally wrong and will always remain a subject of heated debate.

# War on single-use plastic begins today

**PLASTIC BAN** Municipalities have lined up a slew of awareness drives on Tuesday – Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary

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**NEW DELHI:** The municipal corporations of Delhi, in line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Independence Day call to ban use of single-use plastic, have lined up a slew of awareness drives on Tuesday — Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary.

The PM had asked authorities across India to "come up with a definitive step by October 2" in his Independence Day speech.

Besides the Bharatiya Janata Party-ruled municipal corporations of Delhi, the Aam Aadmi Party government has also shown enthusiasm on the subject. Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said, "We are working on a plan to phase out single use plastic."

It will, however, still take the government sometime to notify the Plastic Waste Management bylaws, senior officials said.

Delhi's chief secretary Vijay Dev on Tuesday made the entire staff of the secretariat pledge to "give up single-use plastic in office and in personal capacity". Senior government officials said from October 2, they will "raise awareness against single-use plastic during their ongoing campaign on 'geela kooda, sookha kooda' (segregation of organic and plastic waste)."

"The first phase of the single-use plastic campaign will primarily be ads in newspaper and outdoor media. The subsequent phases will be strategised soon," a government official said.

The three municipal corporations, meanwhile, have scheduled a number of plogging drives in prominent areas of the city which would be led by the commissioners themselves. The Union ministry of housing and urban affairs had asked the civic bodies to start plogging — a Swedish exercise, which involves picking up soft drink bottles and food wrappers while jogging.

The South Delhi Municipal Corporation said it will hold 44 different plogging runs, the biggest of which will begin at Zafar Mahal DTC Bus Stand (Mehrauli), Madipur and Dada Dev Temple (Dwarka). The corporation also declared four schools — DPS (Mathura Road) DPS (Vasant Kunj), Kendriya Vidyalaya (Andrews Ganj) and Birla Vidya Niketan (Pushpa Vihar) — as plastic-free after administering pledges to faculty and students.

Meanwhile, north corporation commissioner Varsha Joshi said they have set up several plastic collection and recycling centres — in collaboration with NGOs like Chintan — where people have already deposited at least 25 tonnes of plastic waste.

"Besides this, we are looking at ways to add plastic waste in hot bitumen for paving roads, which are more durable and last longer," she said.

The east corporation will hold a plogging run at V3S Mall in Laxmi Nagar.

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


## CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME WITH FRANCE



## CELEBRATING 150 YEARS OF MAHATMA GANDHI



This year, Delhi Public School Vasant Kunj commemorated Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary and his immense contribution in the building of our nation. A wide array of programmes was conducted to pay tribute to the Father of the Nation.

Several special assemblies and events were organised the year round, celebrating Gandhiji's life and highlighting the core Gandhian principles of '**Non-Violence**', '**Cleanliness**', '**Practice Before You Preach**' and '**Dignity of Labour**'. Multiple Directorate of Education (DOE) programmes were also undertaken in this regard. Some of the initiatives undertaken are as follows :



### (I) SAY NO TO PLASTIC CAMPAIGN

Use of plastic has become a menace and is the cause of many related problems in the world today. Celebrating Gandhiji's principles of '*Cleanliness and Sanitation*', DPS Vasant Kunj organised a campaign from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2019. Following the DOE's guidelines, this was also an effort to sensitize students about the need to stop the use of single use

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plastic items. Assemblies were organised for the students of classes VI to X in order to sensitize the learners. Display boards were made by the students to address the issue. The students of the Junior School were also addressed by Ms Adita Saxena, Coordinator, Environment Council, DPS Vasant Kunj. The In-charge of the School Canteen was instructed to stop the use of straws, plastic cutlery and plastic bags.



An engaging assembly was organised by the Middle School students of DPS Vasant Kunj on the balmy morning of 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2019. The assembly was attended by the officials from the South Delhi Municipal Corporation. The assembly was part of the school's 150th Birth Anniversary celebrations of Mahatma Gandhi. The theme of the assembly was '*Zero Tolerance to Single Use Plastic*' and making South Delhi a '*Plastic Free Zone*'. Emphasizing this path-breaking initiative of the Government of India, the students presented a thought-provoking skit in the assembly. After the compelling assembly by the students, the MCD officials took centre stage and educated the young minds about the menace of plastic and the health hazards it is posing to the world, at large. They later took an '**Anti Plastic Pledge**' urging the students to vow to become eco-warriors discarding the rampant use of PET bottles, plastic cups, straws and other thermocol items.

## (II) SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAAN

In continuation of Mahatma Gandhi's Birth Anniversary celebrations and the government initiatives, Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan was launched by the school on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 2019. This was also part of the DOE's '*Clean India: Clean School*' campaign. The campaign was undertaken in the school in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Vasant Kunj. The programme commenced with the pledge taken by the students and teachers to not only keep the school, their homes but also the country clean. A two kilometre run was organised and then the school premises, in addition to, the area around the school were cleaned. **A Cleaner India will be a Happier India!** The students of Class VI conducted two special assemblies in which an inspiring skit was presented by them stressing on the urgent need to support and encourage the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan'.

This multi-event panorama held on 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2019, showcased the eclectic talents of a stupendous 750 students, under the able mentorship of their dedicated teachers.


#### (IV) OBSERVANCE OF MARTYRS' DAY





In order to make the students aware of the Indian Constitution, a workshop was organized for the students of Class XI (Humanities stream) on the 8<sup>th</sup> of January 2020. The facilitator of the session was Ms Apoorva Rai, PGT Political Science. The keynote speaker was Mr Saksham Goel (Ex-Student) who holds profound academic records in highly esteemed organisations such as St. Stephens’ College and Harvard University. The key topics discussed were the **Fundamental Duties of the citizens of India and the relevance of the Indian Constitution.**

## DELHI POLICE’S ‘SELF-DEFENCE TRAINING PROGRAMME’

On 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2020 Delhi Public School Vasant Kunj organised an hour long sensitization programme for around a hundred Class VIII students. This session was conducted by the Delhi Police, Vasant Kunj (North) as a part of their Delhi Police Week.



In this session, the Delhi Police officials informed the students about the POCSO Act, 2012 (Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences) and the need to immediately report heinous crimes against children. The students were also encouraged to fearlessly stand up against any inappropriate behaviour and physical abuse.



The officials next informed the assembled students about the 'Tatpar' Mobile App of the Delhi Police and the various important features in the apps and how to use them effectively. Last but not the least, the officials demonstrated several self-defence techniques and strategies to be used by the young boys and girls in times of desperate need.

## CBSE's READING CHALLENGE

In the Preliminary stage, around 200 students registered their names and took the challenge. For the Second stage, total six students were identified (2 each from classes VIII, IX and X). The Reading Challenge aimed at assessing the reading competencies of students and enhancing their comprehension skills.

Twenty-three teachers representing eleven schools from Delhi NCR participated in the workshop.



## Christmas Assembly




