Dear Parents,

Greetings to you all from the Delhi Public School, Vasant Kunj family.

We have successfully come to an end of a fruitful session whereby we take pride in having achieved the goals we had set for ourselves and our young learners. We, at school, would like to ensure that all our students achieve success in life.

You will be glad to know that our students brought laurels to the school by showcasing their talent in a multitude of inter school competitions held recently. Our gifted students showcased their skills and bagged the **Second Position** at “Christmas Fantasy” - an inter school competition held at Holy Child Auxilium School. They received the **Second Prize** in the Music and Art category. They also bagged the **Second** and **Third Position** in the Jamboree Art Competition held at DPS, Sushant Lok. Our young debaters won the **Third Position** and a **Consolation Prize** in the English and Hindi segments respectively, at the Literary Festival organized by DPS Mathura Road. Our Whiz kids won the **Third Prize** in the Junior Flash Computer Quiz, organized by R.S. Junior Modern School. The students with special needs are being tutored for the **National Talent Olympiad** to be held in the month of February.

The school recently organised the following events for the students:

1. **Christmas Assembly**- A special Christmas Assembly was conducted by the Junior School for classes III-V on 24th December, 2018. Students of Class III presented a repertoire wherein quotes from The Bible, a morning prayer followed by a song and poetry recitation emphasized the essence of the festival. Children danced joyfully with Santa to the beats of ‘Merry Christmas’ and ‘New Year’ songs, infusing the spirit of sharing and caring.
2. **‘JIGYASA- 2019’**- An EVS and Maths Festival, was organised for Classes III, IV and V in the month of January and February. With the aim of encouraging curiosity, a scientific temper and critical thinking among students, various activities were conducted during the festival. An array of competitions was held for the students to showcase their talents such as an intra-class Paper Tearing Competition and a ‘Fun with Shapes’ event were organised for the students of Class III ; An inter-section EVS Quiz was conducted for the students of Class IV whereas an inter-section Maths Quiz was held for the students of classes III and IV. The school also organised an Inter Section EVS Competition ‘Ignited Minds’, an intra-class competition ‘Recycle Today for a Better Tomorrow’ and an intra-class Maths event - ‘Sumptuous Shapes’ Competition for Class V . Students of Class IV organized a vibrant and colourful **‘States Day’** wherein the culture, costume and cuisine of various states were

displayed with great enthusiasm. The highlight of Jigyasa was the EVS and Maths Exhibition for the students of Classes IV and V. Students showcased their models, experiments and board games capturing the true essence of Jigyasa.

**3. Swine Flu Awareness Drive-** The school doctor addressed the students and apprised them about the Do's and Don'ts related to Swine Flu. Some precautions included covering one's nose and mouth while coughing or sneezing, using proper hand-washing techniques, confining a Swine Flu patient at home, avoiding touching one's eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands, not to spit in public places and consulting a doctor if symptoms like influenza occur.

**4. Republic Day Assembly-** The junior school celebrated the 70th Republic Day with great zest and zeal on 25th January, 2019. The students of Class V presented a special assembly and showcased their love for their the country. The assembly began with a morning prayer which was followed by a beautiful rendition by the school choir. The children recited a poem on 'Patriotism' and also talked about the significance of 'Republic Day'. This was followed by a dance performance that charged up the atmosphere with patriotic fervour. The assembly concluded with the National Anthem.

Our School Counsellors and Special Educators are conducting group sessions for the students to address issues like bullying, use of foul language, behavioral issues on a regular basis. Students are being sensitized towards differently abled and economically weaker students. A talk was also conducted on Examination tips and how to study in a stress free environment. Throughout the year, remedial classes were held for academically weak students, for all subjects, after school hours. It was a fruitful endeavor and majority of the students have shown improvement in their class performance.

The Term II examinations are beginning from the month of March and the school expects full support from the parents. Please ensure that the work of your ward is complete and corrected timely by the teachers, he/she attends school daily and arrives on time, ready for the day's learning experience. Students who are sick should submit a medical certificate from the doctor, at the time of joining school.
