NEWSLETTER - CLASSES III, IV & V

Dear Parents,

Greetings to you all from the Delhi Public School, Vasant Kunj family.

We are successfully coming to the end of another academic year in the month of March. The Final Term Examination will be conducted from the first week of March. The teachers are ensuring that the syllabi finishes on time and the students have an appropriate level of preparation in all the subjects.

The newly adapted Uniform System of Assessment on Term Assessment basis not only emphasises on regular pen and paper tests but also on written work undertaken throughout the year and the subject enrichment activities. Please ensure that your ward completes his/her work on time, submits notebooks on a regular basis and maintains the notebooks and workbooks properly.

The examination policy for the current academic year, as mentioned in the previous newsletter, at a glance, is as follows:

Term I= 20% Internal Assessment + 80% Mid Term Exam

Internal Assessment=Unit Test (10%)+Notebook Submission (5%)+ Subject Enrichment Activities (5%)

Term II= 20% Internal Assessment + 80% Final Term Exam

Internal Assessment=Unit Test (10%)+Notebook Submission (5%)+ Subject Enrichment Activities (5%)

Final Result=Term I (50%)+Term II (50%)

Students of classes IV and V who score 80% and above shall be given the Scholar Badges.

The school organised the following events for the students, during the academic session 2017-18:

1. The Junior School celebrated its Annual Day - 'Ramayana-The Epic', on 3rd November, 2017 with elation. Around 500 children of Classes IV and V brought to life the beauty of the Ramayana and depicted various aspects of Lord Rama's life that sculpted morals and value systems.
2. JIGYASA -2017, an EVS and Maths Festival was organized for classes III-V from 20th - 22nd December'17, with the aim to encourage curiosity, scientific temper and critical thinking among students. The event comprised of an array of competitions organised by the EVS department, such as, States Day, EVS quiz for class IV, Intra-class Pamphlet Making Competition on 'Eat the best, Leave the rest' for class III and a Declamation Contest on 'Our contribution towards

making Delhi a clean and pollution free city' for students of class V. The Maths department organized a Mathematics quiz for Class V, An Inter- house Geometrical Rangoli Making Competition and Intra-class Mosaic Contest. The highlight of the festival was the EVS and Maths exhibition for the students of Classes IV and V wherein the students showcased their models, experiments and demonstrations capturing the true essence of Jigyasa.

3. Students of Class III presented their Annual Function "Navras" in the month of January wherein 248 students of class III participated. The students depicted the nine 'Rasas' through various dance forms and portrayed how to keep the energy of these rasas in balance so as to rejoice 'life'.

The Final Term Examination is beginning from the month of March and the school expects full support from the parents. Please ensure that the work of your ward is complete and submitted timely for corrections. He/she attends school daily and arrives on time, ready for the day's learning experience. Ample revision is being done in the school as it gives the child an opportunity to apply his/her mind and deal with a variety of questions. Kindly note that the unwell students shall not be allowed to sit for the examination. Students who do not take their term examinations due to illness or some unforeseen mishap need to submit a Medical Certificate and will be eligible for the Scholar Badge at the discretion of the management.

Here are some tips for the parents to help their wards in doing well in the forthcoming examination in a stress free environment:

1. **Start Revising Early** : There's no substitute for beginning your revision work early.
2. **Create a Revision Timetable**: Work out how much time you have and plan how you can use it best by making a timetable.
3. **Find a Stimulating Place to Revise**: A quiet place to study helps the child concentrate. Trying to get work done when surrounded by distractions such as the TV, the internet and other family members can be very challenging, especially for children of primary school age.
4. **Revise Little and Often** :The average attention span of a 10-year-old is around 30 minutes, any longer and they start to get distracted and demotivated.
5. **Eat well**: Avoid giving processed, sugary foods like cereal, biscuits, sweets and chocolate to your ward. Stress on a healthy diet.
6. **Stay Positive** : Break each task down into small, manageable chunks. Stay positive and pass on that positivity to your child and encourage him/her.
