Read some English storybooks.


Show some illustrations to your child and do a lot of picture reading activities to develop observation, creativity and confidence in communication.


Then try to find out:


PROJECT 1

PROJECT 2- EIGHTNESS OF EIGHT

- 1. Watch the video through the video link shared belpw and answer the questions in the notebook.
- 2. Describe what you notice.

PROJECT 3 - DOTTY SIX GAME

- 1. Watch this silent video to see the game being played. Can you work out the rules?
- 2. You need another person, 1-6 dice and a grid like this.
- 3. Take turns to throw the dice and draw that number of dots in one of the boxes on the grid.

 Put *all* of your dots in one of the boxes. You can't split them up and <u>you can't have more than six dots in</u> a box. When a box is full, you could put a cross or a tick in the corner like this:
- 4. Keep playing till all boxes get a tick. The winner is the person who puts the last tick.
- 5. Now, can you try to make your own version? Bring to school after the vacation.

Theme: "My Little Green World"

1. Project / Model: "My Plant Buddy"

Instructions:

1. Take a small pot or recycled container and plant seeds (like moong, mustard, or fenugreek). Give your plant a name!

2.Decorate the pot using stickers, drawings, or colored paper. Observe your plant every 2–3 days. Draw its changes in a simple plant journal (germination, leaves growing, etc.).

3. Water it regularly and place it near sunlight.

Submit the decorated pot and 2–3 journal pages with pictures or drawings.

2. Project Title: "Plant Life Mobile – Hanging Model"

Materials Needed: Chart paper / colored paper, String or thread, Hanger/stick/cardboard strip (for bas, Glue, scissors,


crayons. Tape or stapler

Instructions:Create 4–5 cutouts based on these concept

- 1.One cutout showing a plant (label it as "Living Thing").One cutout showing a non-living thing (like a toy.
- 2. Cutouts of parts of a plant (root, stem, leaf, flower, fruit). Drawings or pictures showing sunlight, water, air, and soil
- 3. Write simple labels on each cutout. Attach strings to the cutouts from a base (a hanger or cardboard strip).
- 1. Decorate and personalize it with the child's name "My Plant Life Mobile".

Bring the completed hanging model after the holidays and share one or two lines about it in class.





3. Project Title: "Bird Feeder – Kindness to Animals"

Materials Needed:1 empty milk or juice carton, Rope, cord, ribbon, or wire, Poster colours and paint brushes, Glue (Fevicol), scissors, Decorations (recycled household items – buttons, paper, etc.). Stick (for perch), Bird seed

Instructions:

- 1.Cut a large hole in the centre of one side of the carton, starting a few inches above the bottom. Below this large hole, make a small hole to poke a stick through for birds to perch on.
- 2.Cut two small holes on the top sides of the carton to thread rope or ribbon for hanging. Paint and decorate your bird feeder creatively using your favourite colours and materials. Fill the bottom of the feeder with bird seed.
- 3. Hang your feeder in a place where birds can easily access it. Also, remember to keep some water nearby for birds, especially during hot days.
