HISTORY

1. Theme: Tree-mendous History

Material required: Pen, History notebook, pictures, a tree sapling, colours.

Task:

- a) Choose <u>any one</u> tree from the following:
 - Pipal tree
 - Mango tree
 - Himalayan Birch tree
- b) Research <u>any one</u> historical source (seal, sculpture, painting, etc.) that depicts the chosen tree in ancient Indian history.

Follow the hints, if needed: Unicorn and Pipal tree Seal, Bodhi tree (Pipal tree), Mahakapi Jataka and Bharhut (Mango tree), Birch bark manuscripts.

- c) In your history notebook, paste a picture of this historical source.
- d) Write answers to the following questions (not exceeding 80 words in total):
 - Which historical source tells you about the tree?
 - To which period does the source belong?
 - Write any other interesting fact or observation about this historical source.
 - Do you think our ancestors understood the importance of trees? Give one reason.
- e) Finally, choose <u>any one</u> of the following:
 - Under the supervision of an adult, plant the sapling of the tree you chose in your garden or community park. Take a photograph of yourself with the newly planted sapling. Paste it in your notebook.

• In your notebook, draw and design a painting featuring your chosen tree.

Remember to branch into past, dig deep and get your thumbs green!

OR

2. **Theme:** Domestication of animals

Material required: Pictures, colours, pen, History notebook.

Task:

- a) Snap a selfie with your pet dog or cat (or a majestic portrait if they are feeling camera shy).
- b) In your history notebook, paste this photograph and note your pet profile (not exceeding 20 words):
 - Name
 - Breed (if known)
 - Interesting habit/ characteristics

- c) Turn into a detective and research on your pet's past. Find out:
 - When and where this species first moved in with humans?
 - How it has been used by humans throughout history?
 - Compare your pet to its wild ancestor.

In your history notebook, write the answers for the questions mentioned above in not more than 60 words in total.

d) Finally, choose <u>any one</u> of the following:

• Research and draw a historically accurate timeline depicting the transition of early humans from hunter gatherers to rearing animals.

• Based on your research and imagination create an artwork (sketch/ printed collage/ painting/ other) representing your pet's journey from wild species to domesticated. Paste it in your notebook.

• Briefly describe and paste picture of <u>any one</u> ancient historical source that sheds light on your pet species (not exceeding 15 words).

Remember, history isn't just dates, it's about processes shaping our world. So, bring in your pet's tail-wagging enthusiasm, and dig into the past with a pawsitive spirit !

CIVICS

1. **Theme:** Exploring Diversity Through Travel

Material required: Pen, Civics notebook, folder and travel mementos.

Task:

- a) Collect mementos, photographs, and testimonials from your travels.
- b) In your Civics notebook, write a short reflection (not exceeding 80 words) on the following topic:

• Describe the differences and similarities between your place of residence and your travel destination.

Use the following headers to answer:

- ✓ Introduction: Write the name of the city where you reside and your travel destination.
 Note the number of days you stayed at the destination.
- ✓ <u>Choose category/categories</u>, <u>as applicable</u> to compare the two places:
 - Physical Characteristics: Talk about the delightful things you saw! Were there mountains, forests, rivers, deserts, snow, a big city with tall buildings or a serene village with big open fields, etc.? Describe the weather- was it cold, rainy, or snowy, etc.?
 - Cultural Aspects: Did you see any special celebrations or traditions? Perhaps a captivating dance, a vibrant festival, or a yummy feast?
 - Lifestyle: What's the routine like at both places? Did you try a new food, clothing, or learn a new game?

 \checkmark Conclusion: At the end, write how travel enriched your life with variety.

OR

 - On which date was the sunrise observed earliest?
 - Which was the longest day?
 - What is the pattern of increase or decrease in the duration of daytime?
- d) Research on summer solstice and write a brief description (not more than 30 words).

Note: Paste this table in your geography notebook and write the answers to all the questions.

Steps (for video): Introduce yourself, show your house or apartment and then introduce your family


Steps (for scrapbook): Paste or draw your picture and introduce yourself, a picture of your house or apartment and describe it and then a picture of your family introducing the members of the family.
