Dear Parents

Greetings!

The commencement of the academic session 2025-26 has seen the corridors of the campus abuzz with excitement and activity characteristic to the dissemination of knowledge.

The following scheme of studies is to be followed for the students of classes VI-VIII:

Periodic Assessment(PA)/Monday test(MT) - MTs will be conducted as per the schedule given in the almanac. The test will be based on the outlined syllabus for the two terms. The syllabus shall be provided by the subject teachers prior to the scheduled date. Students are allowed to appear for **re-test in any ONE subject** only per term as per the date given in the almanac.

- Computers is a NON-EVALUATIVE subject, however grades are awarded.

Multiple Assessment(MA) – MA is a part of internal assessment and aims at evaluating the performance of students more comprehensively using multiple and diverse techniques such as oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, concept maps, graphic organisers, visual representation etc.

Portfolio Assessment (PF) – A portfolio is an extension of notebooks developed subject wise. The assessment would include classwork and homework assignments that assist in evaluating the students' progress. Besides this, portfolio should be a space for student to display his/her exemplary work in the related area.

Subject Enrichment Activities (SEA) –The subject specific activities are aimed at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. These activities will be conducted throughout the year and shall be evaluated at the term end. Activities such as recitation, role-play, declamation, picture reading and debate shall be carried out to develop effective speaking and listening skills in language. Hands on activities, Lab work, Project work shall be evaluated in Mathematics, Science and Social Studies.

NOTE- Art Integrated Project (AIP) will be evaluated under SEA for 2nd Term.

Co-Scholastic Activities -Students will be graded in various areas including Work Education, Visual and Performing Arts, Health, Physical Education, and Discipline to ensure their holistic development. Grading for co-scholastic activities will be based on important factors such as regularity, sincere participation, output, and teamwork. The school proudly offers a wide range of clubs to support extracurricular learning and also provides coaching classes for specific sports activities. Additionally, educational trips will be organized during the school year to enrich the students' learning experience.

House System - In the Senior School, there are six houses. Upon admission, every student is assigned to one of these houses. Inter-house activities are organized regularly, providing valuable opportunities for student engagement and development.

Report Card -The report card shall be issued to the students at the conclusion of each term, which will reflect the marks scored, by the student for each subject. The final result shall take into account 50% marks secured by the student in Term-I and 50% marks secured by student in Term-II. Student securing 80% and above marks in final result shall be eligible for receiving Scholar Badge at the end of the academic session.

NOTE: A report card if lost can be re-issued on paying a fine of Rs. 300/-.

SIGNIFICANT RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Please ensure that your ward wears the RFID card and carry school almanac every day to school. **NOTE:** RFID card if lost can be re-issued on paying a fine of Rs. 500/-.
- 2. Parents to carry yellow colored identity card/gate pass to enter the school any time of the day
- 3. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has framed guidelines for Safe Transportation of school children. Going an extra mile to ensure the safety and security of its students, the school has deputed teachers in the buses. In case a teacher is not available who is travelling from first pickup to the last drop lady guards have been deployed. Therefore, the parents, who are continuing to send their wards by private vans/cabs, are advised to avail the school bus service at the earliest as the Delhi Traffic Police and Transport Departments are taking action at their own end under the Motor Vehicle Act 1988 from time to time against such school vans/cabs which are plying illegally.
- 4. Students are **NOT** allowed to bring Mobile phones, I-Pad, Smart watches and Cameras to school. If a student brings a mobile phone to school, it shall be confiscated. The phone shall be returned only at the end of the academic year, provided the parent comes to school and pays fine of Rs.2000/- and submits a letter of apology.
- 5. Students are **NOT** allowed to bring any sharp edged instrument to school, eg. knife, cutter, 3-3blade etc.
- 6. Vaping is STRICTLY prohibited in the school premises. Any student found in possession of a vape, will be expelled from school. Further, a fine of Rs 5000/- will be imposed on the student.
- 7. The students will be given a **Red Card** or a **Yellow Card** in case of any indiscipline caused by them.
- 8. Students should not bring crackers and colours to the school. Bursting of crackers and playing with colours is liable to lead to expulsion of a student from the School.

- 9. Students are **NOT** allowed to celebrate their birthdays in school.
- 10. Students found using unfair means during any examination, shall be dealt with very strictly and will not eligible for a scholar badge.
- 11. Kindly ensure that your ward does not have a Facebook, Instagram or any other social networking account as this can be misused for luring youngsters to engage in anti-social activities.
- 12. Kindly check uniform, haircut, nails and punctuality of your ward.
- 13. There are three PTMs in the entire session, the dates of which are already mentioned in the school almanac. You will also receive a message before every PTM on class WhatsApp group of parents. Kindly attend the PTMs regularly.
- 14. Unwell students will **NOT** be allowed to attend school or take any Test or Examination.
- 15. Parents can meet any of the school authorities only after taking prior appointment with the concerned person through the school almanac.
